Payment of Filing Fees

- Filing fees are due at the time that a petition or document is filed with the Court.
- Absent a judicial waiver, attorney filers are required to pay fees electronically through pay.gov.

<u>Exception</u>: A represented debtor may pay the initial case filing fee through his/her attorney, by money order or certified check, or by cash payment delivered to the Clerk's Office in the exact amount. The Clerk's Office does not make change. Please do not send cash through the mail.

- *Pro se* filers may pay filing fees in the form of a money order or certified check. The Clerk's Office also will accept personal checks of pro se filers, with the exception of debtors with active bankruptcy cases. A *pro se* filer may pay in cash if it is delivered to the Clerk's Office in the exact amount.
- Any payment by money order/check must be made payable to: <u>Clerk, U.S. Bankruptcy Court</u>
