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GENERAL NOTICE TO ATTORNEYS AND THE PUBLIC

CHANGE IN OFFICIAL BANKRUPTCY FORM 7 -- THE STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL AFFAIRS

- This form must be completed by the debtor in every bankruptcy case;
- Four (4) additional questions have been added to Form 7;
- Every Corporate or Partnership Debtor MUST Answer Questions 19 - 25 ;
- Every Individual or Joint Debtor in business within six(6) years MUST answer Questions 19 - 25.

341 HEARINGS -- DEBTOR PICTURE ID and SOCIAL SECURITY CARD REQUIRED

For cases filed January 1, 2001 and thereafter, the United States Trustee's Office is now requiring that all individual Chapter 7, 11, 12, and 13 debtor(s), at the 341 hearings, must provide the Trustee with picture identification to verify their identity and also proof of their Social Security number.
