GENERAL ORDER NUMBER 1996-1

In all Chapter 13 cases filed on or after June 1, 1996, counsel for the debtors are required to utilize the form Chapter 13 plan and, as to modifications, the form modification plan promulgated and distributed in this District which are attached hereto. Counsel's signature on the petition and in any other pleadings in the case shall be deemed to constitute a certification by counsel that the plan or modification is identical in every respect to the terms of said standard form.


If the debtor intends to propose a plan provision which is different from the standard form, the form should recite the following in all caps and underlined text:


"SEE ATTACHED PAGE FOR ADDITIONAL PLAN PROVISIONS."


In such event, Debtor's counsel will be required to serve the 341 meeting notice and the plan or the modification as required in accordance with the terms of an Order requiring service on all parties in interest in the case which will be issued by the Court.

Failure to comply with the terms of this order shall be grounds for an immediate dismissal of debtor's case and imposition of sanctions as to the attorney of record.
